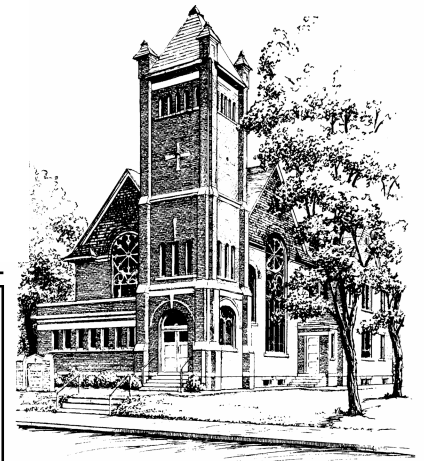

## Dave's Deliberations...

Friends,

In Mark's gospel, Jesus compares the Kingdom of God to a Mustard seed which is the smallest of seeds that grows into the largest of shrubs. Not long ago I read that not only is a mustard plant big... it's tenacious and that once it takes a hold you pretty much can't get rid of it. That's another aspect of God's kingdom too isn't it? Once the reign of God takes a hold in a family, in a church, in a community, it is tenacious and tends to take over everything. God is Good! When God's love in Jesus Christ takes a hold in our hearts... when we see and understand what God has done for humanity on the cross and in the empty tomb ... it begins to transform our actions and our attitudes, our opinions and our convictions, our loves and our hates, our relationships and our roles in the larger world. When it takes root in a community of faith it begins to transform worship, study, and mission into a reflection of itself that is visible to the world. When it takes root in the larger community, nation, world it has the capacity to transform injustice into justice, unfairness into fairness, hunger into fullness, hatred into love. From the smallest seed to the biggest and most tenacious bush.

In the pages of this newsletter that follow you will see many examples of ways in which Memorial Presbyterian Church of Dayton is sowing the mustard seeds of the Kingdom of God. Primary of among those examples are the Kid's Closet, the food pantry, Habitat for Humanity, Sunday School and others. This week was "PandaMania!" our 2011 Vacation Bible School. We had 70+ children in our church for five days. It was a raucous, noisy, joyful week full of friendship, love, and learning. Will all the kids remember ALL the things they learned? Probably not, but MANY, MANY "mustard seeds" were planted in those young lives and the Kingdom of God has already begun to take root. Those seedlings may be small now, but the Reign of God has a way of starting small and growing big. It is a tenacious presence in peoples' lives... and we have taken part in the planting. That is important work! Thanks to Jane Coleman and her whole creative, hard-working, kid-loving crew of leaders, snack makers, song-leaders, registration takers, craft makers, drama creators, game-players and "Chadding" discussion leaders. Thanks for being the faithful body of Jesus Christ that you are!

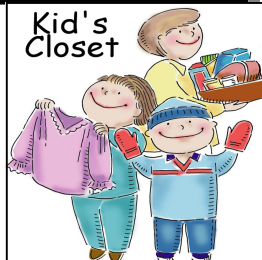

# Staying in the *Word* Together - 2011



Join Christians throughout North America as they read together – each Sunday – the scriptures for the week. Known as the Revised Common Lectionary (RCL), the collections of readings are organized so that after a three year cycle, members of churches will have read through the majority of the Bible. In our church, our Sunday school curriculum follows the RCL.

As a church and denomination, we use the RCL and provide these to the pastors for direction on the order of worship and for guidance in Christian Education. A guest pastor may choose not to use the scriptures, but we are providing them to the congregation as a means of ***Staying in the Word Together***. 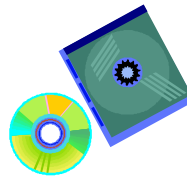

The PNC has been meeting weekly and actively reviewing “pastor information forms” (PIFs). The PNC continues to use the following process:

- Requesting the Church Leadership Connection identify possible matches to our church information form. To date we have reviewed 160 PIFs for review.
- Reviewing all PIFs to determine potential matches to our congregation and sending a select group a supplemental questionnaire. To date we have sent questionnaires to 34 potential candidates.
- Reviewing submitted supplemental questionnaires and sermon recordings. To date, 11 questionnaire responses have been received from candidates.
- Based on the questionnaires, 6 candidates have been selected for phone interviews.

Over the next month or two, the PNC will be reviewing additional PIFs (receiving an average of 16 per week) and identifying candidates for phone interviews. We will also be checking references and ultimately identifying candidates (2-3) to give a sermon at a neutral pulpit prior to making our recommendation.

Please keep the PNC in your prayers. We appreciate all the support from the congregation as we continue this process.

## 2011 PANDAMANIA!

Have you ever seen so much Wildness? At PandaMania we know how much “God is Wild About Us.” We have a church that supports this vital mission that our community embraces. Please pray for the seeds that were sown this past week, both children and adults!

We averaged 66 children per day, our high attendance of 69, low of 63. Adult & teen volunteers averaged 47 per day, not including the 5+ adults who helped with the Friday night program and reception. Our daily offerings totaled \$107.01, which will be used to buy food for the Dayton Food Pantry. 176 pounds of food was collected for the Pantry. Our offering received at the Friday night program, to help offset the program costs, was \$311.18.

We continued our focus on crafts and missions time more toward missions and less ‘stuff’ for our kids. We colored about 30 backpacks and bookmarks to go to Central South America. Numerous cards made by our kids will be delivered to the Mulberry Retirement Home.

I hope I did not forget anyone in the list of volunteers who helped. This church comes together in a tremendous way to be the hands and feet of Jesus. We are blessed to be a blessing. Thanks to the Fellowship committee who stepped up to serve us Friday night (Yum!) and Ivamarie Kelley for all the extra administrative ‘stuff’ that gets done!

## Glee Hand Bell Choir on August 10th @ 7:00 pm

The Glee Hand bell Choir from Tokyo, Japan will perform at 7:00 pm on Wednesday, August 10th at Bethany Presbyterian Church in Lafayette. Bethany Presbyterian Church is located at 3305 Longlois Drive in Lafayette. Admission is free. A freewill offering will be taken to help the students with their expenses.



The choir was formed 36 years ago at Meiji Gakuin Higashimurayama High School in suburban Tokyo as part of it's Open Doors for International Friendship program. The High School is a private Christian school founded by the Presbyterian and Reformed church missionaries more than 100 years ago and encourages student exchanges in other countries.

The Glee Hand bell Choir is the leading hand bell choir in Japan and is internationally known. Every 2 years the school sends the choir to the United States, and it has performed widely, from the Riverside Church and Carnegie Hall in New York City to the Crystal Cathedral in Los Angeles. This year's tour includes performances in Pennsylvania, South Dakota, Nebraska, Iowa, Wisconsin, Indiana, Michigan and California.



The Choir includes 14 girls and 3 boys this year. They will bring a delightful evening of music that will cover a wide range of musical arrangements. The director is Takanobu Onoda. Memorial Presbyterian Church in Dayton and Bethany Presbyterian Church in Lafayette are co-sponsoring this event. Norimichi Odate, who is the chairman of the Open Doors Program, knows Rev. Ron Kelley from their days at Western Seminary in Holland, Michigan.

We will need homes for the visiting hand bell choir students & adults. We have 14 girls (7 homes needed) and 3 boys (1 or 2 homes needed) and also homes for 2 or 3 adults. If you help with a home for 2 nights (coming in on Tuesday late afternoon and leaving on Thursday morning) you will be responsible for 2 breakfasts and one lunch. You would also need to transport the students to the church on Wednesday. They will have dinner at the church that evening before the concert. If you are able to house any of the students or adults please contact Ivamarie Kelley at the Memorial Church office from 9:00 am to Noon (296-3199) (or her cell 336-981-4125).

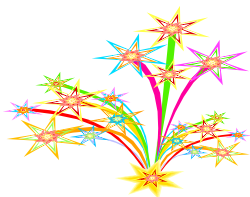
